Depending on your professional goals, where you intend to seek licensure or plan to practice, and the licensure requirements that exist within that state, several pathways to licensure may be available to graduates of Lesley's Masters in Clinical Mental Health Counseling programs. Applicants and students are encouraged to discuss program offerings with our admissions counselors and advisors to ensure that they pursue the degree that most closely aligns with their professional goals.

I. State Professional Mental Health Counseling Licensure

Massachusetts Licensed Mental Health Counselor

Our 60-credit Masters in Clinical Mental Health Counseling degree, including specializations in Holistic Studies, School and Community Counseling, and Trauma Studies, meet the current educational requirements for Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC) licensure in Massachusetts.

The 60-credit Masters in Clinical Mental Health Counseling: School and Community Counseling specialization also **meets** the licensure requirements for Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) Initial Licensure (see II(a) below).

Please note, the 48-credit Masters in Counseling Psychology: School Counseling specialization **meets** the licensure requirements for Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) initial licensure (see below II(b) below) but **does not meet** the licensure requirements for Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC) licensure.

Out-of-State Professional Mental Health Counseling Licenses

Professional mental health counseling licensure requirements vary from state to state, are a matter of individual state legislation, and are outside of the control of educational institutions. State licensing boards make determinations as to whether an applicant's program of study meets the educational requirements for a license at the time of licensure application.

- **A.** Lesley's University's 60-credit Clinical Mental Health Counseling programs' curricula **meets** the current educational requirements to apply for licensure in professional mental health counseling in the following state: Massachusetts
- **B.** Per an internal review process by Lesley University, our 60-credit Clinical Mental Health Counseling programs' curricula also **meets** the current educational requirements to apply for licensure in professional mental health counseling in the following states: Alabama, Alaska, Colorado, Delaware, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Iowa, Louisiana, Maine, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Dakota, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Washington, Wisconsin, and Wyoming, and in Puerto Rico.
 - a As noted above, state licensing boards make determinations as to whether an applicant's program of study meets the educational requirements for a license at the time of licensure application, and Lesley University has no influence on individual licensure determinations.
- C. Lesley's University's 60-credit Clinical Mental Health Counseling programs' curricula **do not meet** the current educational requirements to apply for licensure in professional mental health counseling in the following states, but graduates may be eligible to apply with supplemental course work or additional field training experiences: Arizona, California, Connecticut, Illinois, Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, New Hampshire, Ohio, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, the District of Columbia, and West Virginia.
 - a Individuals who intend to pursue professional mental health counseling licensure in one of the states listed in category C are strongly encouraged to request guidance from state licensing boards as to whether supplemental coursework, field training, or other actions would be necessary to make them eligible to apply for professional mental health counseling licensure in that state.
- D. Lesley's University's 60-credit Clinical Mental Health Counseling programs' curricula do not meet the current educational requirements to apply for licensure in professional mental health counseling in the following states and graduates of our Clinical Mental Health Counseling programs are ineligible for professional mental health counseling licensure in the following states: Arkansas, Florida, Kansas, Kentucky, and North Carolina.

II. Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) Initial Licensure:

Massachusetts School Adjustment Counselor and School Counselor Licenses

School Adjustment Counselor (All Levels) Initial License

Lesley University's 60-credit Masters in Clinical Mental Health Counseling: School and Community Counseling specialization **meets** the current educational requirements to apply for licensure in School Adjustment Counseling in Massachusetts upon degree completion.

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School Counselor (All Levels) Initial License

Lesley University's 48-credit Masters in Counseling Psychology: School Counseling specialization and 60-credit Masters in Clinical Mental Health Counseling: School and Community Counseling specialization **meet** the current educational requirements to apply for licensure in School Counseling in Massachusetts upon degree completion.

• **Note**: The 48-credit School Counseling specialization does not meet the licensure requirements for the Licensed Mental Health Counselor license in Massachusetts.

Out-of-State School Adjustment Counselor and School Counselor Licenses

Professional school counseling licensure requirements vary from state to state, are a matter of individual state legislation, and are outside of the control of educational institutions. State licensing boards make determinations as to whether an applicant's program of study meets the educational requirements for a license at the time of licensure application.

- **A.** Lesley's School and Community Counseling and School Counseling programs' curricula **meet** the current educational requirements to apply for the School Adjustment Counselor and School Counselor initial licenses (respectively) in the following state(s): Massachusetts.
- B. Lesley University has not made a determination whether our School and Community Counseling and School Counseling programs' curricula meet the current educational requirements to apply for School Adjustment Counselor or School Counselor licenses, or comparable licenses, in the following states: Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico.
 - a. Individuals who intend to pursue school counseling licensure in one of the states listed in category B are strongly encouraged to request guidance from state licensing boards as to whether supplemental coursework, field training, or other actions would be necessary to make them eligible to apply for school adjustment counseling licensure in that state.

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Periodic Review of Licensure Regulations and Moving to a New State

It is important for all applicants and students to understand the specific requirements of the state in which they intend to apply for licensure or seek employment, and to periodically review the requirements in order to be aware of any future changes to those requirements. If a student's plans for where they intend to seek employment change, they must become aware of the requirements for licensure for the new state.

Throughout the Program, students are required to keep the University informed of any changes in their location (state) via the <u>Address Change Form</u> available on the Registrar's Office webpage.

Lesley University's Masters in Clinical Mental Health Counseling programs and Masters in Counseling Psychology programs are encompassed by Lesley University's accreditation by the New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE).
