Licensure Information for Students and Applicants

Professional social work licensure requirements vary from state to state, are a matter of individual state legislation, and are outside of the control of educational institutions. State licensing boards make determinations as to whether an applicant's program of study meets the educational requirements for a license at the time of licensure application.

I. State-by-State Listing: Bachelor-degree Level Social Work Licensure

- A. Lesley University's Bachelor of Social Work program meets the current educational requirements for graduates to apply for the respective Bachelor-degree level license in the following states: Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, Delaware, District of Columbia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Virgin Islands, Virginia, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming.
- **B.** According to the Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB) website, there currently is **no state licensure process** for Bachelors-degree level social work practice in the following states, though some states may have legislation in process that could require such licensure in the future: California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, New York, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, Vermont, Washington.
- **C.** Lesley University **has not made a determination** whether the Bachelor of Social Work program meets the current educational requirements to apply for Bachelor-degree level social work licensure in the following states: Alabama and Iowa.
 - a. Individuals who intend to pursue social work licensure in one of the states listed in category C are strongly encouraged to request guidance from state licensing boards as to whether supplemental coursework, field training, or other actions would be necessary to make them eligible to apply for social work licensure in that state.

- **B.** Lesley University has not made a determination whether the Master of Social Work program meets the current educational requirements to apply for Master-degree level licensure in the following states: Alabama, Florida, and New York.
 - a. Individuals who intend to pursue social work licensure in one of the states listed in category B are strongly encouraged to request guidance from state licensing boards as to whether supplemental coursework, field training, or other actions would be necessary to make them eligible to apply for social work licensure in that state.

Periodic Review of Licensure Regulations and Moving to a New State

It is important for all applicants and students to understand the specific requirements of the state in which they intend to apply for licensure or seek employment, and to periodically review the requirements in order to be aware of any future changes to those requirements. If a student's plans for where they intend to seek employment change, they must become aware of the requirements for licensure for the new state.
